Who is St Barnabas Hospice?

St Barnabas Hospice is a charity which supports more than 10,500 people across Lincolnshire each year. We provide specialist care for people who are living with a life-limiting or terminal illness, as well as supporting their families and carers. We aim to support our patients to live their life as fully and independently as possible.

What is Hospice at Home?

The St Barnabas Hospice at Home team works across Lincolnshire and is made up of specialist doctors, registered nurses, physiotherapists, occupational therapists, wellbeing professionals and health and rehabilitation support workers.

Working alongside GP's, district nurses and other healthcare professionals, the team helps patients to stay at home if this is their choice. This allows them to spend precious time in familiar surroundings with people, animals and other support systems that may be important to them. The support offered can be physical, emotional, spiritual and/or social. All the care and support provided is free of charge.

We're here for patients and a vital support for family and loved ones.



How can the Hospice at Home team help?

The Hospice at Home team provides specialist care to those living with a life-limiting and terminal illness. This includes symptom management and working out a personalised care plan for each patient.

Patients and their families are supported to continue living with their diagnosis and plan for their future care. This includes having important conversations about what matters and how to let loved ones know their wishes.

Care

When a patient comes into the care of St Barnabas, they have access to a specialist group of clinicians who work together with you and your community team to ensure all aspects of care are met. The care plan is patient-centred and reflects the patient's wishes and choices.

Patients may be discharged back into the care of the community team if their current needs have been met and there is a plan in place. However, St Barnabas Hospice operates an open referrals service should a patient need us again in the future.

Welfare and Benefits

There are also dedicated members of the team who can support patients and families to access benefits, spiritual care, therapies and counselling.



How to refer

You must be registered with a Lincolnshire GP to be referred to the Hospice.



There are two ways to refer to St Barnabas Hospice, either through an existing healthcare professional or by self-referral.

- **Self-refer by calling** the number below.
- **Through a doctor/nurse.** Patients can speak to their doctor, nurse, other healthcare professional or family member involved in their care to make the referral on their behalf by calling the number below. A patient's permission will need to be given before a referral can be made.
