St Barnabas Hospice: Through the years

1979

A small group of people with a total of just £270 set up a Charitable Trust with the aim of opening a local hospice.

1982

A nursing home was purchased by the Trust in Lincoln, where a four-bed unit was opened.

1989

An 11-bed inpatient unit was opened in Lincoln. Day care and home care services were launched.

2001

Day centres were established in Gainsborough, Sutton-on-Sea, Lincoln, Boston and Spalding.

2014

A ground-breaking six-bed hospice opened in collaboration with the NHS within Grantham and District Hospital.

2017

A range of events took place to mark 35 years of St Barnabas offering compassionate care to the people of Lincolnshire.

2022

St Barnabas celebrated its 40-year anniversary. During our four decades of operation, we have cared for more than 100,000 people.

When life was dark, St Barnabas offered light for Lisa



Lisa Hartley from Spalding has been receiving life-changing support from St Barnabas Hospice since 2020.

After a longstanding spinal injury, Lisa suffered from a heart attack, meningitis, a brain swell, and she contracted sepsis twice. All these issues combined gave her chronic heart failure and she was given only 48 hours to live.

Against all odds, she survived and improved, but her doctors told her that there was nothing more they could do for her. Lisa

got in touch with St Barnabas for support, and this has changed her life drastically. Since then, the charity has provided her with medical care, mental health support, including counselling, financial advice, specialist furniture to help with her mobility, and physiotherapy.

The one thing Lisa wanted more than anything was to ride Monty, her 26-year-old stallion, again, and with St Barnabas' help, she was able to get back in the saddle for the first time in 18 months and feel like the old Lisa.

“Thanks to St Barnabas, I can visit Monty and my other horses, look after them and ride when I feel well enough. It is through this care that I can keep on being me.”

Why having a Will is important

Wills are an important way of making sure your wishes are known, and that the things you have worked hard for during your life will go to the people and causes that you hold dear.

Types of gifts

Residuary gift

A residuary gift, or 'share of your estate', is the percentage of your estate that you choose to leave to a beneficiary. It will not devalue over time.

Pecuniary gift

A pecuniary gift, or 'cash gift', is an exact sum of money. Inflation may devalue the amount over time, so you might like to ask your solicitor about linking it to the Retail Price Index, to ensure it maintains its value.

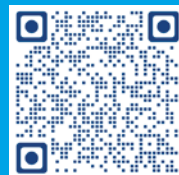
